# Second research



As a used platform, it is very versatile. Although it also advocates people to recycle their items, there are too many consumer inducing messages on it. But it has a community feature that I think is very good.



It's an app that recycles clothes and sells them by brand categories for users. You can drop it off yourself at a drop-off point, which is environmentally friendly because, well, the delivery also causes pollution.

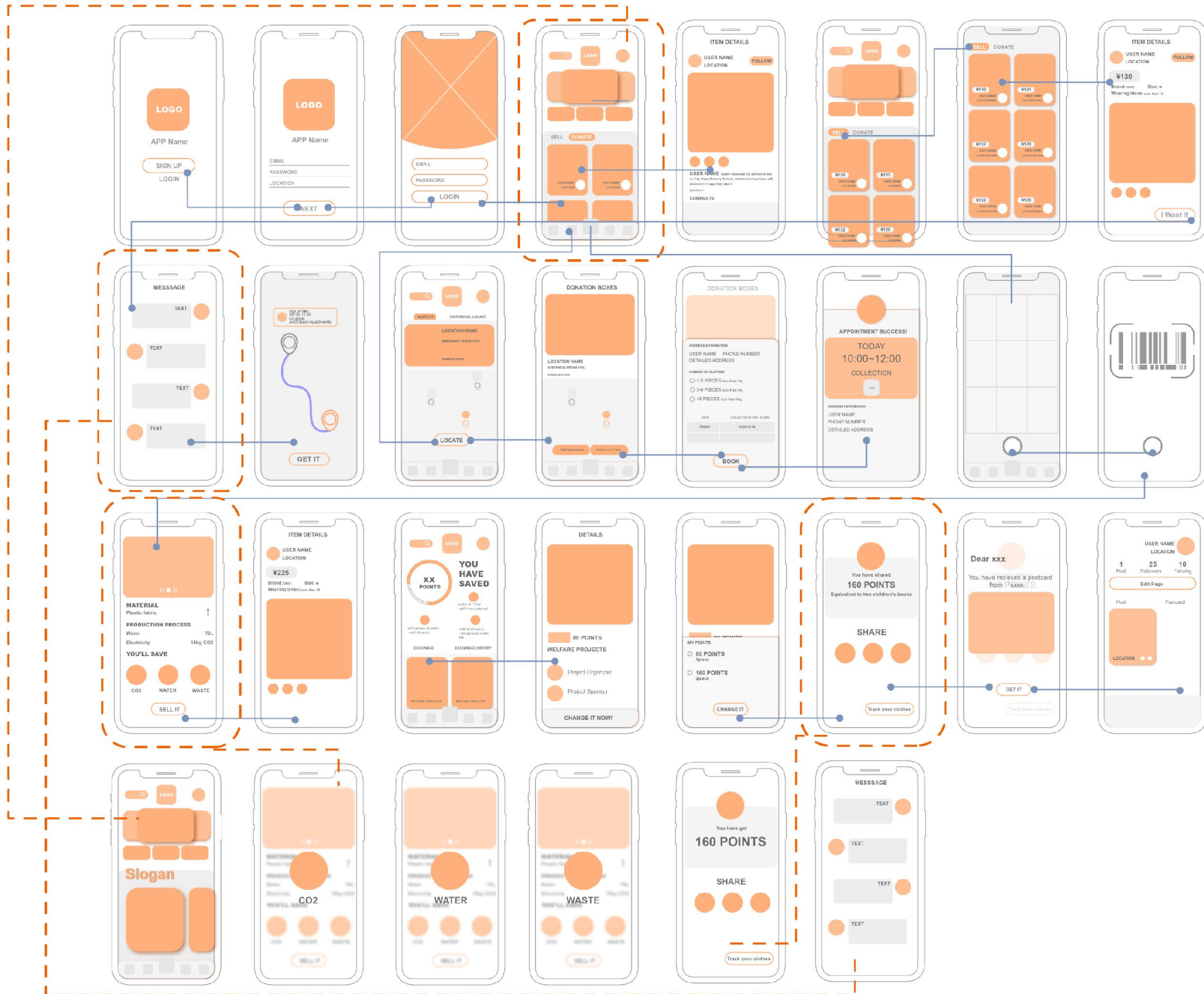


# Preliminary test feedback

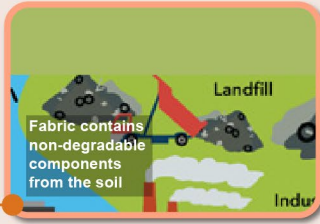
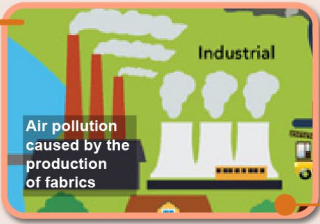




# Scan page

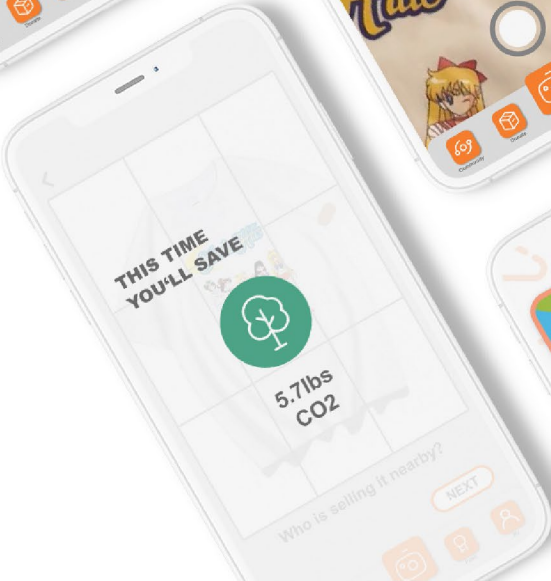

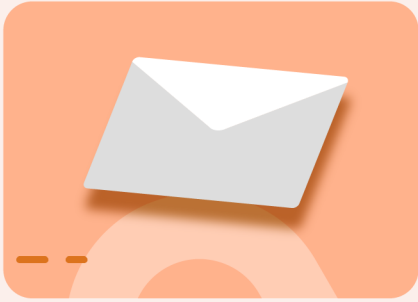

# Rewards page

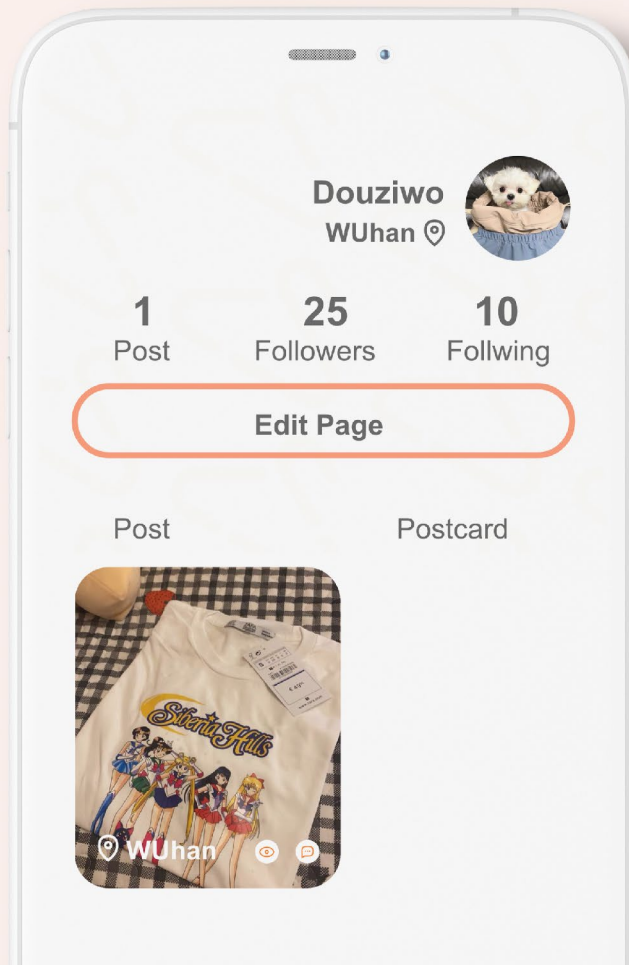

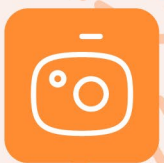

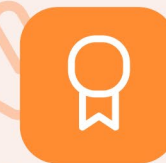
